#### **Message from the President**

It's been a long-standing cliché to begin an issue of the Clarion with a phrase something like, "The Association has had an eventful year," and 2018 is no exception...but this year is in a category all its own! By the time you read this, the CLA Board will have made a formal offer to purchase the dam from the Trustee of Paul Kelley's bankruptcy estate, and we are looking forward to a court hearing around the middle of June. We are confident that our offer will be accepted, and that the CLA will finally become the owner of the Clary lake dam.

Final details, of course, are still to be worked out, but the key message to our members is this: none of this would be happening without the overwhelming financial support you provided in response to our April appeal for donations. Including matching funds from two very generous special donors, the dam purchase and repair fund stands at something over \$125,000. This will allow us not only buy the dam this year but to make the permanent repairs needed so the water level can be managed for the sake of all, and FINALLY meet the requirements of the Department of Environmental Protection's Water Level Order of 2014. A complete list people who have contributed can be found on our website, which list includes many non-members from the wider community. Also included below is a list of the non-members who have donated to our fundraising campaign. The Board and I are simply awestruck everyone's generosity.

I can't begin to thank by name all those who have worked so hard to make this possible, including our friends at Maine DEP, but I would certainly be remiss if I did not call out George Fergusson, our Secretary, water quality monitor, lake level measurer winter and summer, and general gadfly on the matter of the dam, for special praise and the undying thanks of the Board and membership. # **Dam Purchase Update**

As President Burson indicated above, the Bankruptcy Court hearing date will be in mid to late June. We are confident that the Court will approve the sale of the dam to us, and the closing should take place either at the hearing or within 3 business days of the hearing. There is a great deal of work to do between now and then to get ready to accept ownership of the dam. We know everyone is anxious for news about this exciting event, and while we'll provide periodic updates on our website as information becomes available, please understand that until the actual court hearing, we won't know much more than we do now. #### **Annual Meeting Notice**

Normally held on the first Satuday in August, due to scheduling difficulties (and an incredibly busy summer) this year's Annual Meeting will be held on the second Saturday of the month, August 11th at 2:00 PM. The meeting will be at the Old MacDonald farm on Route 126 in Jefferson, traditionally known as Derby Oak Farm and now owned by Jesse Spector and Logan Higger. Derby Oak Farm is directly across the road from where the meeting has been held for the last 2 years. The meeting will be held rain or shine: if the weather cooperates the meeting will be held outside, if not it will be held in the spacious barn. Coffee and water (both hot and cold varieties) will be provided. As usual there will be a pot luck supper at the conclusion of the meeting so plan accordingly! There is plenty of parking available; some seating will be provided but you might want to bring a lawn chair or two.

Included with this newsletter is a Membership form/remittance envelope, and we encourage everyone to send it in with your Membership dues early! We know a lot of you for your own reasons like to wait to renew at the Meeting. That is fine, but remember, our Membership year runs from the beginning of one Annual Meeting to the beginning of the next Annual Meeting so in order to participate in and vote at the Meeting, you have to be a paid-up Member for the coming year. Therefore, if you're going to pay your dues at the meeting, please arrive a little early to sign up and have some time to settle in before the Meeting starts. We'll have the registration desk set up and ready to go no later than 1:00 PM. We will start the Business Meeting at 2:00 PM sharp.

Annual dues are (still only!) \$25 per Member which entitles you to one vote; (continued on page 2) (Annual Meeting, continued from page 1) additional family members if they wish can also pay dues and be counted as a voting Member. If you need additional Membership forms there is a printable form on the Association website (look under the "Membership" main menu heading). Alternatively, you can also sign up or renew your Membership online using our secure PayPal payment processing system.
